



### Five Pillars of Islam

These are the five obligations that every Muslim must satisfy in order to live a good and responsible life, according to Islamic teaching.



**Shahadah:** sincerely reciting the Muslim prayer of faith

**Salat:** performing ritual prayers in the proper way five times a day

**Zakat:** paying a charity tax to benefit the poor

**Sawm:** fasting during the month of Ramadan

**Hajj:** Making at least one pilgrimage to Mecca during one's lifetime.

**The Third Pillar of Islam – Zakah – Giving to Charity**

**The Fourth Pillar of Islam – Sawm - Fasting**
